

## PRE-K: DINOSAUR FEET

Related academic subjects: fine arts, language arts, science, and social studies.

**Teachers: For safety reasons, please cut out the foot openings in each box beforehand.**

1. Close the flaps of the box and seal with tape.
2. Trace a dinosaur foot on a piece of construction or colored paper and cut it out (if the box is especially large, you might need to tape two pieces of paper together).



4. Cut an X in the center of this piece that matches up with the foot opening in the box.
5. Cut out small triangles for claws and glue them to the tips of the dinosaur's toes. Add any other decorations you'd like.
6. Glue the paper to the top of the box.
7. Repeat all of the above steps for your other foot.
8. Wear, stomp, and roar!

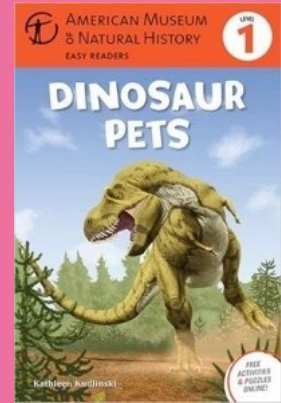


## MATERIALS:

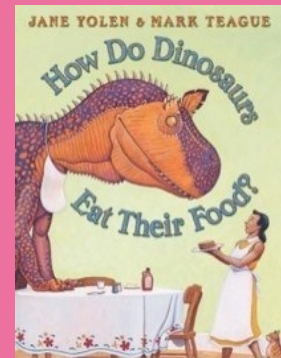
1. Pressed cardboard boxes

7. Glue



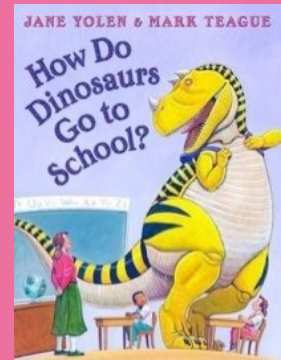
