

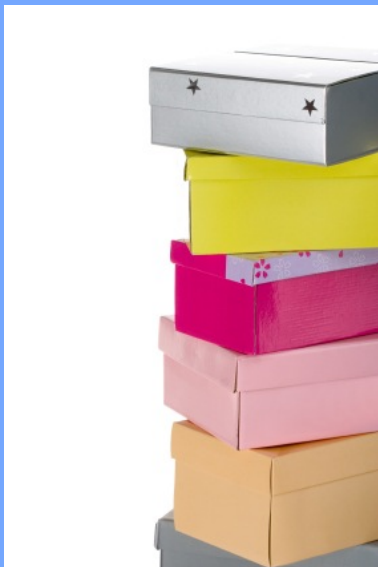
## K-2: ROYAL CROWN

Related academic subjects: fine arts, language arts, and social studies.

1. Cut a piece of pressed cardboard big enough to fit the front of your head.
2. Cut triangle or half-circle pieces from the top of the piece.
3. Decorate with colored pencils, crayons, markers, paint, and/or stickers.
4. Punch holes on both sides of the piece.



5. Thread a 10" piece of ribbon or yarn through each hole.
6. Tie at the back of your head.
7. Think of what you want your royal name to be.

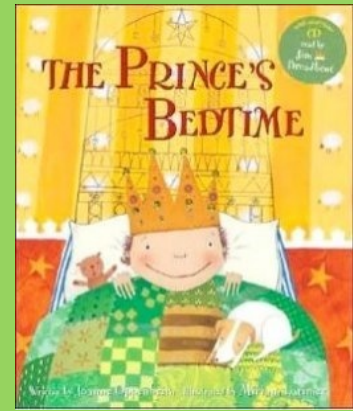


## MATERIALS:

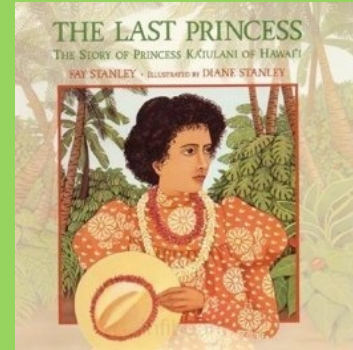
1. Pieces of pressed cardboard

5. Ribbon or yarn



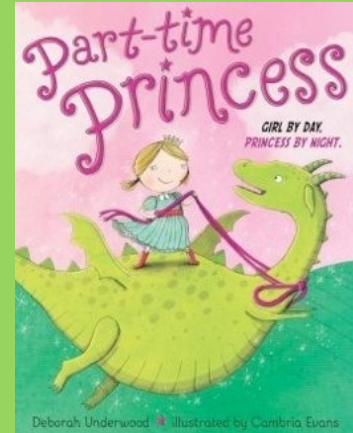
