

PRE-K: SHAPE PRINTERS

Related academic subjects: fine arts, language arts, and mathematics.

1. If working with paper towel tubes, then cut into fifths. If working with toilet paper tubes, then cut in half.
2. Form each piece into one of the following shapes: circle, diamond, heart, square, and triangle.
3. Set out containers of finger paint with each of the following colors: red, orange, yellow, green, blue.



4. Dip the end of each stamp into the dish of finger paint and press onto a piece of paper.
5. Name each shape and color as you go.

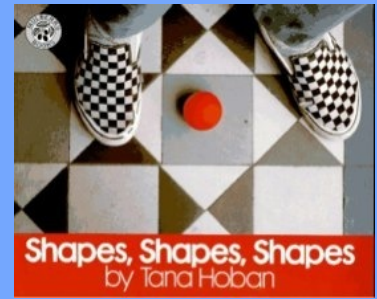


MATERIALS:

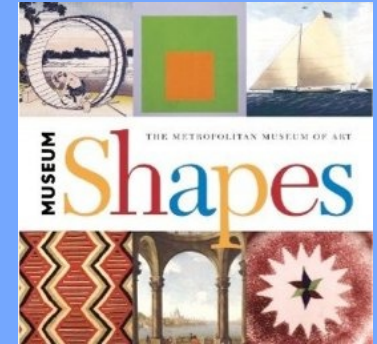
1. Paper towel or toilet paper tubes

5. 8.5" x 11" sheets of white paper



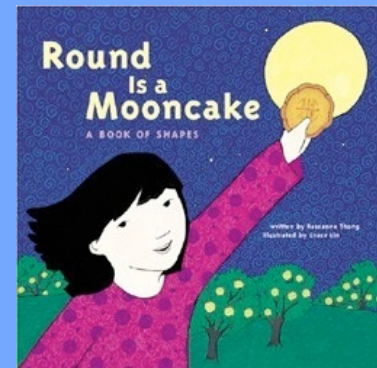
