2. Draw six boxes either side of a sheet of white paper.
3. Draw a picture of yourself in one of the boxes and color it in.
4. Write the number of people in your family in another one of the boxes.



5. In the remaining boxes, create drawings and color them in for each item on your list. You may also find magazine pictures for these items.
6. Tape a chopstick to one side of the paper to act as a flagpole.
7. Share two of your favorite things about your flag with your classmates.
8. Have a classroom flag parade!

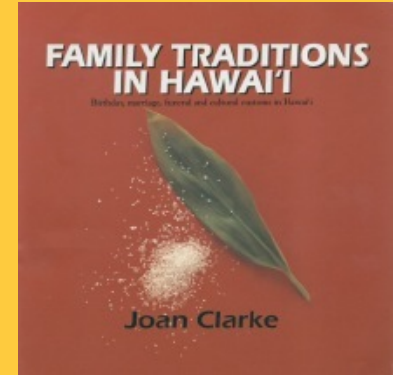
1. Half-sheets of scrap paper

7. Tape



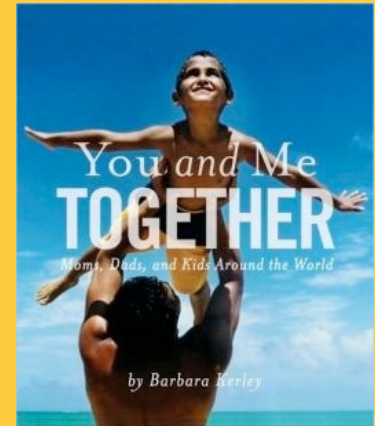
