1. Look at Wassily Kandinsky's "Color Study: Squares with Concentric Circles."
2. List five things (like colors, shapes, and sizes) you notice about the painting on a piece of scrap paper or a half-sheet of folder paper.

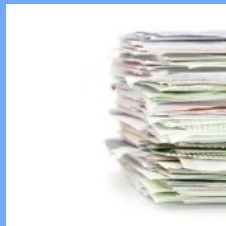


3. Get a 4" x 6" piece of pressed cardboard to use as backing.

5. Display your masterpieces in the class gallery.

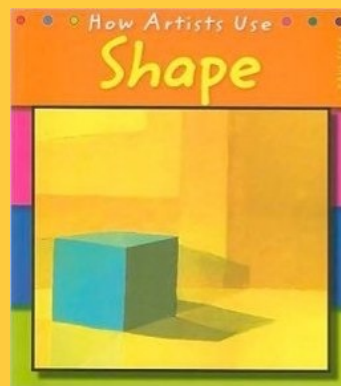

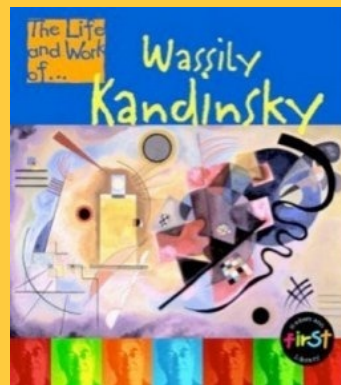
1. 4" x 6" pieces of pressed cardboard

5. White glue



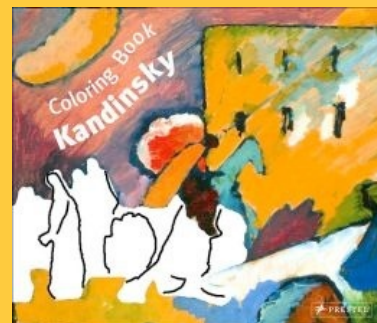
