On a piece of paper, draw a side-view picture of a tiger shark. How is its body shaped? What does its face look like? Are there any markings on its skin?

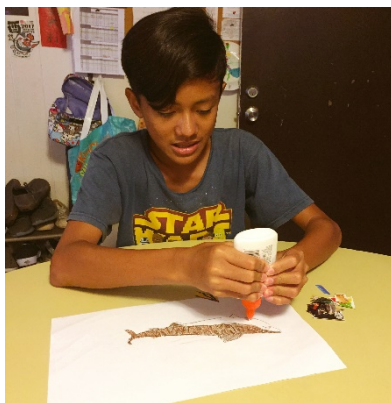
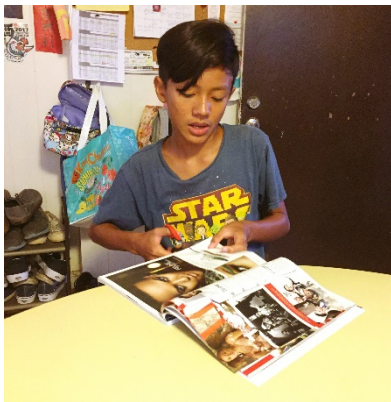
